54% of CEOs Say Top Spot is More Complex than Expected,
Feel Isolated from Staff

Summary: A new survey from RHR International reveals that over half of CEOs (54 %) feel the job was not what they originally expected and that half feel isolated in their role. To some degree, isolation is part of a CEO's job. A CEO can only share so much with his colleagues before he is open to favoritism or is ill-advised by those who may have their own agendas. First time CEOs are particularly susceptible to this isolation with nearly 70% of those surveyed saying it negatively affects their performance.
